Mauro Ariel Koliva

b.1977 (Posadas, Misiones, Argentina)

Mauro Koliva's artwork is heavily influenced by the tumultuous historical trajectory of Argentina, which organically comes from the artist's practice of allowing the subconscious to flow freely onto canvas and paper.

Perhaps as a result, Koliva has remained highly visible in the Latin American Art world specifically, through local art programs. He attended the seminar "Art: Special Projects" coordinated by the artists Sonia Abián and Mónica Millán, at the Misiones Cultural Center from 2000-2001; promoted the Contemporary Art Center Project with the group known as "La Pandorga" based in the city of Oberá in 2004; attended the "Workshop for artistic action thinking" coordinated by Francisco Ali-Brouchoud in 2005; and participated in a clinical analysis and production of works directed by Pablo Siquier, Tulio De Sagastizábal and Fabian Lebenglik in the city of Posadas, also in 2005. In 2006, Koliva was Assistant Coordinator at the Museum of Contemporary Art at the National University of Misiones.

Koliva has also become well noted internationally, and is part of private collections in a number of countries including: Argentina, Brazil, Uruguay, Spain, Mexico and the United States.
